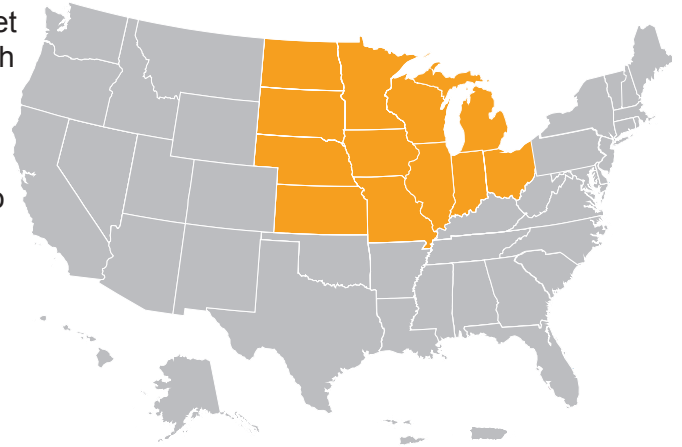


Capacity Building Assistance (CBA) Provider Network Midwest Regional Technical Assistance (TA)
